# **Thoughts from Pastor Dean**

# 'Occupy'

I love to hear the voice of Jesus. I listen to Jesus speaking to me daily as I pray, read the Bible, and practice His presence. He speaks to me every day his words of love, grace, power; all that reflect the reality of my identity as a son of the Heavenly Father. Since the beginning of 2017 he has spoken a reoccurring word, 'occupy'. Over time I have come to believe that this word is for both me personally and us as the family of Shepherd of the Lakes.

At first, I was unsure what to make of this word. What was I to occupy? Was this a challenge or an invitation from God? Over the last few weeks, how I am to respond to what Jesus is saying has become clearer. Pastor Mary and I have been preaching on Profiles in Courage from the Bible and I originally was going to speak of Tamar and her courage to do what it takes to get justice, a story from Genesis 38. But as time drew closer to the message, I felt the Holy Spirit calling me to preach from Joshua 1, the story of God commanding Joshua to take the Israelites across the Jordan and possess the land that He had promised to give them.

God said, "My servant Moses is dead. Get ready now, you and all the people of Israel, and cross the Jordan River into the land that I am giving them." Joshua 1:2 (TEV)

God had promised the Israelites a home of beauty, yet they had wandered for 40 years in the desert because of their lack of trust in Him. They needed to let go of the past and step out in faith into the future that God was giving to them. Moreover, though God was gifting them the land, they would have to fight for it, trusting the presence and power of God to give them victory.

I believe the word 'occupy' is not only for me but also for us a congregation. God has gifted us with what we need, and as sons and daughters of the King he gives us the authority and power to claim the world around us for the Kingdom.

Through the Son, then, God decided to bring the whole universe back to himself. God made peace through his Son's blood on the cross and so brought back to himself all things, both on earth and in heaven. Colossians 1:20 (TEV)

# **Thoughts from Pastor Dean cont.**

Jesus has shed his precious blood on the cross reconciling the world to the Father. The victory is now won; all things in heaven and earth have been brought back to God. We are being called out of our status quo, to step out in faith, occupying that which our Father is giving to us. He has given us our neighborhoods and community, but we need to cross over out into the land to claim it for the King of Love. There will be battle ahead. Threat from the outside and fear from the inside will rise.

Are you ready? Are your priorities in godly order? Are you willing to give more than you receive, to serve more than you are served, to not only receive the love of Jesus but to reflect it to a lost and hurting world as you go out?

Let us ready ourselves as we obey the command of Jesus,

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and <u>make disciples</u> of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

# Welcome KHUSA Director, Lisa Stafford!


